

Government and Commerce

Georgia is under the jurisdiction of the Consulate General of Chile in Miami. Hernán Nuñez Montenegro has served as Consul General since March 2019. Chile first established a consular presence in Georgia in 1899. Ms. Erika Monckeberg serves as the current Honorary Consul of the Republic of Chile in Atlanta.

The state of Georgia has had continuous representation in Chile since 2005, helping hundreds of Georgia companies with export requests. Veronica Medina has represented Georgia in this market since 2018.

The Georgia Department of Economic Development led a logistics and trade-focused mission to Santiago in fall 2016, and another took place in 2024.

Georgia is home to the Chilean American Chamber of Commerce of the South (CACS). CACS focuses on the continued success of the U.S.-Chile Free Trade Agreement by leveraging efforts of Chilean companies looking to do business in Georgia. Robert Palaima currently serves as president.

Georgia is also home to the Georgia Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (GHCC) and the Latin American Chamber of Commerce of Georgia (LACC), which both provide resources to Georgia companies looking to do business in Chile.

Academics

In the Fall semester of 2024, 79 Chilean students will be enrolled in USG schools.

The University System of Georgia (USG) offers 20 different study abroad, exchange and internship programs in Chile in programs such as language,

engineering, international affairs, history, and international business.

Emory University also provides study abroad programs for students in Chile.

Arts, Film and Culture

In 2015, the Atlanta Film Festival screened *Bear Story*, an Academy Award winning short film directed by accomplished Chilean director and writer Gabriel Osorio.

International Trade

EXPORTS: In 2023, Georgia exports to Chile totaled \$685.7 million. Chile is the 19th largest export market for Georgia.

Top exports from Georgia to Chile include turbojets, petroleum gases, automatic data processing machines, civilian aircrafts, and telephone transmission devices

Georgia leads the nation in the export of the following good to Chile: turbojets, malt beer, kraft paper, and chocolates

IMPORTS: In 2023, Georgia imports from Chile totaled \$2.1 billion. Chile ranks 18th among Georgia's importer nation.

Top imports from Chile include refined copper, fluorine, pneumatic tires, Inorganic salts, and wood

Capital Investment

There are at least **17** Georgia companies with operations in Chile, including but not limited to:

There are several Chilean facilities operating in Georgia, including Arauco North America and CMPC USA.

Transportation

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport offers daily direct flights between Atlanta and Satiago, Chile. In 2024, the airport expects 385 flights between Chile and Georgia carrying over 109,000 passengers.

Delta Air Lines signed a joint venture agreement with LATAM in 2023.

The Georgia Ports Authority (GPA) in Brunswick has a relationship with two port cities in Chile. The GPA offers shipping services to Puerto Angamos and San Antonio.
